Welcome to Our Summer Camp 2026 Guidelines



Rather than focusing on a single subject, this 1-month full-immersion programme gives students a balanced foundation in language, thinking, creativity, and real-world skills all while living, learning, and exploring together on one of Southeast Asia's most beautiful islands.

Set in Langkawi, Malaysia, the camp blends structured daily classes, hands-on application, outdoor adventure, and guided independence into a safe, enriching summer experience.

Programme Overview

A 1-month full-immersion experience for students aged 11–15. Max 20 students per intake. Four core courses, weekend adventures, and an island that turns learning into a lived experience.



English

Build confidence in speaking, listening, reading, and writing through daily classroom learning and real-world use.



Mandarin

Introductory conversational exposure to Mandarin — listening, basic speaking, and cultural familiarity.



Finance

Age-appropriate financial literacy: money management, saving, spending, basic investing, and team simulations.

Creative exploration through visual art, design thinking, clay work, painting, and architecture model making.

Dedicated Guardians & Supervision

*Student-to-Guardian Ratio:6:1 | 3 lead chaperones + 1 assistant chaperone for all 20 students
| All staff fully vetted and trained*

Every student in our care is supervised around the clock by a dedicated team of trained chaperones. Our guardians are not just rule-enforcers — they are mentors, trusted adults, and the familiar face your child will turn to throughout the programme.

-  Supervise All Activities **Guardians are present and attentive during every class, workshop, excursion, and free time — no unsupervised moments.**
-  Nightly Check-ins **Each evening, guardians conduct a personal check-in with every student before lights out — ensuring wellbeing, comfort, and readiness for the next day.**
-  Daily Parent Updates **Parents receive a photo and brief written update every day via WhatsApp or email. You will always know what your child got up to.**
-  Attendance & Discipline **Guardians manage daily attendance, enforce routines, and handle conduct matters with a fair, consistent, and restorative approach.**
-  Escort Everywhere **Students are never left to navigate the island alone. Guardians escort the group to every destination — airport, classes, excursions, meals, and back.**
-  Emotional Support **From homesickness to friendship challenges, our guardians are trained to listen, support, and gently guide students through the social and emotional side of camp life.**

Staffing & Supervision

-  Certified ESL Teachers **Native or near-native English proficiency with international classroom experience, trained for multi-level groups.**
-  Qualified Mandarin Instructor **Experienced language teacher with cultural context to make Mandarin engaging and memorable.**
-  Specialist Facilitators **Finance and Art sessions delivered by practitioners with real-world expertise in their fields.**
-  Guardian Team **3 lead chaperones (male and female) plus 1 assistant — first-aid trained, emergency-ready, on call 24/7.**

What to Bring — Packing List

Langkawi is hot and humid year-round (28–34°C). Pack light but complete. All accommodation is air-conditioned.

CATEGORY	ITEMS
Clothing	7–8 casual outfits, 1 light jacket, swimwear (2 sets), walking shoes, sandals, hat or cap, sufficient undergarments for 30 days
Toiletries	Toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, body wash, sunscreen SPF 50+, insect repellent, deodorant, personal medications with prescription copy
Sleep	Pyjamas (bedding and pillows are provided)
School Supplies	Notebook, pens and pencils, small day backpack for excursions
Electronics	Phone with charging cable, universal adapter if needed — no laptop required
Documents	Passport (original + photocopy), travel insurance card, allergy or medical information letter from parents
Spending Money	Small personal allowance in MYR or USD for souvenirs — all activities, meals, and transport are fully covered by the programme fee
Nice to Have	Personal water bottle, small flashlight, playing cards, zip-lock bags for wet beach day items
Do NOT Bring	Alcohol, cigarettes, vaping devices. Electronic gaming devices are strongly discouraged — we want students fully present and engaged.

Parent Communication Policy

We understand that sending your child abroad is a significant step. Our communication policy is designed to give parents real peace of mind while helping students grow in independence and resilience.

-  Daily After-Dinner Video Call **Every evening, 8:30–9:00 PM (MYT, UTC+8). A dedicated, supervised window for students to connect with their families — consistent, predictable, and something to look forward to.**
-  Daily Parent Update **Each day, guardians send a brief written message — including a photo, activity summary, and any wellbeing notes — via WhatsApp or email based on parent preference.**
-  Emergency Line — 24/7 **A dedicated guardian phone number is provided at registration. Parents are contacted immediately if a medical concern or unexpected situation arises — no waiting, no delays.**

Scheduled call window: 8:30–9:00 PM MYT daily | Daily photo update from guardian | Emergency contact available 24/7

Behaviour & Conduct Policy

Legacy Point Academy maintains a respectful, safe, and inclusive environment for all students. Our approach is restorative — focused on understanding, accountability, and growth — not shame or punishment.

Our Expectations

- Treat fellowstudents, staff, and the local community with respect at all times
- Follow guardian instructions promptly and cooperatively
- Attend all scheduled classes, activities, and meals
- Maintain personal hygiene and a tidy shared living space
- Observe lights-out and quiet hours
- No physical aggression, bullying, or targeted exclusion of any kind

Staged Response Framework

Stage	Trigger	Response
Stage 1 — Verbal	Minor rule breach or disruptive behaviour	Private conversation with guardian; student is heard, expectations re-stated clearly
Stage 2 — Formal	Repeated breach or disrespectful conduct	Written incident note; parent informed same day; reflection task assigned
Stage 3 — Serious	Aggressive behaviour, bullying, or continued non-compliance	Removed from group activities; mandatory parent call; behaviour contract signed
Stage 4 — Dismissal	Danger to self/others or continued serious breach after Stage 3	Early departure arranged with family; programme fee non-refundable

Wellbeing & Homesickness

It is completely normal for students to feel homesick, especially in the first few days. Our team is experienced in supporting students through this transition — with care, patience, and the knowledge that it almost always resolves quickly once the routine and friendships take hold.

What We Do

- Every student receives a personal welcome from their assigned guardian on arrival day — their first friendly face on the island
- Students are paired with a 'buddy' from the group during the first week to help them settle in quickly
- Guardians conduct a brief private check-in with each student each morning during Week 1
- The structured evening family video call gives students something consistent and comforting to look forward to
- Week 1 activities are deliberately fast-paced and social — keeping students engaged, connected, and happily busy

For Parents: How You Can Help

- Trust the process — most homesickness resolves within 3–5 days as routine and friendships take hold
- During video calls, stay upbeat — ask about their favourite activity that day, a new friend, or something funny that happened
- Avoid suggesting they come home during a difficult call — this can deepen the feeling rather than ease it
- If you are concerned, call the guardian directly for an honest, full update

In our experience, students who initially struggle are often the same ones most reluctant to leave at the end of camp. The connections made here are genuine.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the age group?

Students aged 11–15 years old. All activities, classes, and supervision are designed specifically for this range.

What is the maximum group size?

Each intake is strictly capped at 20 students, ensuring an intimate, high-quality experience with genuine personal attention for every child.

Do students need to speak English already?

No. We support beginner to advanced levels. Students are placed in appropriate groups on arrival and progress quickly in an immersive environment.

Who are the teachers?

All English instruction is by certified ESL teachers with international experience. Mandarin is taught by a qualified instructor. Finance and Art are run by specialist practitioners.

Can parents book flights independently?

Yes. We strongly recommend the airline's "unaccompanied minor service" for solo travellers. Our team manages all airport arrivals and departures in Langkawi. (we can arrange assistance for arrival in KLIA airports too)

Are meals included?

Yes—three nutritious, halal-friendly meals daily. All dietary restrictions and allergies are fully accommodated. Please declare at registration.

Is the programme safe?

Safety is our highest priority. Accommodation is fully gated. Students are supervised 24/7. Nearby medical facilities and insurance are included. Clear emergency protocols are in place.

What if my child gets sick?

Guardians are first-aid trained with access to clinics and Langkawi's main hospital. Parents are notified immediately. Insurance coverage is included in the programme fee.

Is early departure possible?

We discourage it as it disrupts the student and the group. In genuine emergencies, early departure can be arranged. Programme fees are non-refundable outside the cancellation policy.

What about homesickness?

Completely normal—and our team is experienced in handling it. The buddy system, daily check-ins, and the structured family call window help students adjust, usually within a few days.
